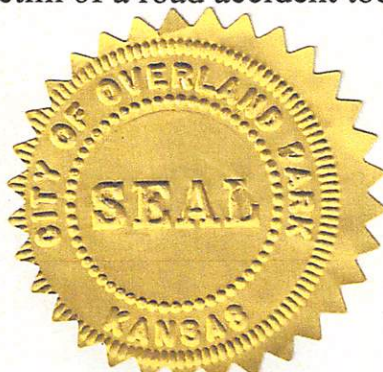
Whereas, November 15, 2020 is World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims


Whereas, November 13, 2005 is World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims;
