Because of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, every state was required to create this document to show how they were working to protect people who walk, roll, and bike on their roads.



BikeWalkKC compared the VRUSAs of Kansas and Missouri and shared our findings. Our work not only gained national attention, but also pushed MoDOT to start developing a new VRUSA.

Inclusive Transportation with Veronica O. Davis

BikeWalkKC hosted Veronica O. Davis, transportation expert and author of *Inclusive Transportation: A Manifesto for Repairing Divided Communities* for a conversation about why centering equity is critical for building better transportation systems for all people. Sharing how her own family has been harmed by racist transportation policies, Davis called for bold, new thinking and more diverse leadership to create transportation networks that connect people with jobs, education, opportunities, and each other.



Community Planning



"I've gone from actively avoiding the street to feeling like it's a lovely addition to my walk to and from work." After years of advocacy, neighbors along Emanuel Cleaver II Boulevard won safety improvements that slow down drivers and protect pedestrians and bicyclists from car traffic. BikeWalkKC analyzed the data and found that the number of people walking, biking, and rolling nearly tripled after the road diet, protected bike lanes, pedestrian islands, and improved crosswalks were installed!

By the Numbers

RideKC Bike

This summer, RideKC Bike refreshed our fleet with new, higher efficiency batteries. The new batteries have over 40% more capacity than the previous batteries, helping our riders take more trips and ride longer distances with fewer battery swaps.

Youth and Adult Education

When we launched the Safe Routes to School program in 2012, the idea of teaching 50,000 students to ride a bike and walk safely to and from school seemed out of reach. It's community support that has gotten us to this milestone!
